Maybe it won't be raining this whole weekend as it has been for seven weeks straight, so maybe you'll go outside and need to know these things!

TRAFFIC ALERT- THE NORTH AVENUE BRIDGE NEW ROCHELLE

The North Avenue bridge replacement project continues to progress. The contractor is scheduled to begin demolition of the outermost sections of the bridge on **Monday, Oct. 30**.

- Demolition will occur overnight requiring lane closures and traffic stops on I-95 and North Avenue.
- This work is anticipated to take approximately three weeks to complete.
- Two out of three lanes in each direction on I-95 will be closed overnight on weeknights, starting as early as 10 p.m. with full reopening by 5 a.m.
- North Avenue will transition to a one-way alternating traffic pattern after 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. on most work nights.
- In mid-November, multiple traffic stops lasting up to 20 minutes will take place concurrently on I-95 and North Avenue to allow cranes to safely load large sections of steel onto flatbed trucks below on I-95.

WESTCHESTER COUNTY LAUNCHES ‘RECYCLE COACH’ MOBILE APP

Free app designed to help make recycling and solid waste information more accessible to County residents. This app features a scanning function that uses image recognition technology to identify items. Residents will now be able to use the app to scan items in order to determine how to recycle the item. This will help residents recycling and allow for more informed purchasing decisions. Local municipalities will also be able to share their municipal collection schedules, calendar of events, and provide information on service disruptions. Users can access Recycle Coach for free from their desktop computers and mobile devices. The app can be downloaded from the App Store or Google Play.


